Obituary

Olga Cadet, age 82, died in her home at 10:35am on Saturday, April 11, 2020. Olga was born to Mr. Merogene Oristel and Hosanna Leveque, in the nurturing town of Anse D'hainault, Haiti. She was born on June 24th, 1937. Olga was their only child.

Mommy spoke highly of Anse D'hainault, and also of her father. She told me many stories about Grandpa Merogene and his workers. Mommy would describe Grandpa Merogene as a wise landowner, and she described how he did his best to avoid conflicts and to diffuse possible standoffs. He was a peaceful man, and she always referred to his parables whenever she had the opportunity. She told me the stories so often that I could feel, at times, as if Grandpa was actually telling me the stories himself, although I had never met him. Mommy was a member of the church choir and the performing arts program during her happy childhood. She even performed for President Paul Eugene Magloire when he visited her town. Mommy often talked about how she was able to capture her audience with her voice. She enjoyed performing, and she did so to bring honor to her family.

Soon after receiving her high school diploma, she secured a teaching position as a substitute teacher, and then later as a permanent teacher. Mommy was an avid reader. She used to tell me that I could learn so much more than what a learning institution had to offer if I would simply pick up a book and read.

She married her ex-husband, Clervau Cadet, at an early age, in 1956. They had four lovely children—Marie Rolande, Marie Lesnie, Jean Carmin, and Wilbrode Cadet. Mommy loved her children, but realized that in order to secure a better future for them, she had to leave them with her aunt Camelia (aka Cam) in Anse D'hainault so that she could journey to the capital, Port-au-Prince, Haiti. Olga spoke highly of Auntie Cam, especially when it came to all of the things Auntie Cam did to support my mother and my siblings. Even more than her father, Auntie Cam was revered in our home. Every good-deed or act was somehow associated with Auntie Cam.



Soon after her arrival in Port-au-Prince, Olga met a man named Vieux Moise, at St. Anne Cathedral. The two fell in love, and later welcomed their bundle of joy, Stanley Moise, into the world on December 10, 1972. He would grow up to become her lifelong confidant. Finally, Olga was able to send for her other children, and they were all reunited. She struggled with raising her five kids, but she made it work. She made sure they attended school, and she created a nurturing home for all of them. Olga was a devoted Catholic until her son Stanley introduced her to Eben Ezer, the Seventh Day Adventist church. The two were baptized on his birthday in 1983. She occupied many roles in the church, from deaconess to committee member. She loved to pray and to attend prayer services, until her final breath.

From 1981 to 1984, she arranged for all of her children to travel abroad. She received tremendous support from the older ones, especially from Marie Rolande (Maille), who provided financial support and guidance. Via administrative error, her birth certificate erroneously identified her birth date as June 25, instead of the correct date of June 24. She never fixed the error. Olga migrated to the United States in 1985 to join three of her children in New York, while Jean Carmin was living in California, and Marie Lesnie resided in Montreal, Quebec. Olga believed in supporting her children and helping them to have a better life. Mommy was a listener, a strong woman, an educator, an independent woman, and more than anything else, mommy was my universe. That is her legacy.

Olga (Mommy Azou) is survived by her ex-husband, her brother Gilbert Leveque and her five children, as well as three daughter in-laws, nine grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.
